Pool News and Opening

Stoney Brook ACC

My name is Parker Wright and my family and I have been residents of Stoney Brook since 1992. Barbara Turner, Mary Plant (temporarily while we look for a replacement for Joe Chuhran) and I comprise the Architectural Control Committee (ACC), and our mission, like the rest of the Board, is to help maintain the appeal of our neighborhood. We do this by assisting homeowners and builders when additions or other structures are planned, or landscaping changes/improvements visible from public spaces are made. Our guidance comes from the Stoney Brook Design Standards, which are included in our homeowners documents. We also, rarely, call upon Peachtree City Code Enforcement if there is an obvious longstanding code issue.

Before you make any of the above landscaping or structure changes, even up to and including changing paint colors or replacing your mailbox, you must contact the ACC for approval of the design. Did you know that you must also contact the ACC (and Peachtree City) before you remove any living trees above a certain size? How about the Peachtree City Code requiring automobiles to have current tags and be drivable (ie. not being refurbished or housed under covers) if they are parked outside? Also, vehicles must be parked on pavement but can temporarily have two wheels in unimproved areas (natural area).

This past winter, some residents found it necessary to park in the street rather than sled down their fairly steep driveways into their backyards or the lake. When it is icy, try the two-wheel method above. The Board/ACC has no jurisdiction with cars parking on the street and is limited to those directives laid out in our Covenants and Design Standards. Think of us as "strict Constitutionalists." Anyway, if you need a copy of those documents they are available on the Stoney Brook website (http://stoneybrookptc.com/Home_Page.php) for reference. When Icy, Park At the Clubhouse
